COMPLAINT

JURY TRIAL DEMANDED

Plaintiff Paul Hacic, by his attorneys Simmons Hanly Conroy LLC and the Law Offices of Mitchell Garabedian, brings this action against The Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y.; Province of St. Anthony of Padua of the Conventual Franciscans, also known as St. Anthony of Padua Province of the Conventual Franciscans; St. Anthony of Padua Province, Franciscan Fathers Minor Conventual, U.S.A.; Franciscan Fathers Minor Conventuals of Buffalo, N.Y.; Franciscan Fathers Minor Conventual, St. Anthony of Padua Province; Order of Friars Minor Conventual, St. Anthony of Padua Province, U.S.A., Inc.; Our Lady of Angels Province, U.S.A.; Franciscan Friars-Our Lady of the Angels Province, Inc.; and St. Francis High School of Athol Springs, N.Y., and alleges, on personal knowledge as to himself and on information and belief as to all other matters, as follows:

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. This Court has personal jurisdiction over the Defendants pursuant to CPLR 301 and 302, in that each Defendant either resides in New York or conducts or, at relevant times conducted, activities in New York that give rise to the claims asserted herein.

2. This Court has jurisdiction over this action because the amount of damages Plaintiff seeks exceeds the jurisdictional limits of all lower courts which would otherwise have jurisdiction.

3. Venue for this action is proper in the County of Erie pursuant to CPLR 503 in that one or more of the Defendants reside in this County and a substantial part of the events or omissions giving rise to the claims asserted herein occurred in this County.

PARTIES

4. Plaintiff Paul Hacic ("Plaintiff") is an individual residing in Port St. Lucie, Florida.

5. Defendant The Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y. ("Diocese of Buffalo") is a religious corporation organized pursuant to the New York Religious Corporations Law, with its principal office at 795 Main Street, Buffalo, Erie County, New York. The Diocese of Buffalo is a Roman Catholic diocese. At all relevant times, the Diocese of Buffalo created, oversaw, supervised, managed, controlled, directed and/or operated institutions of the Diocese of Buffalo, including during all relevant times, St. Francis High School of Athol Springs, N.Y. At all relevant times, the Diocese of Buffalo oversaw, managed, supervised, controlled, and directed religious order priests assigned to work in institutions of the Diocese of Buffalo.

6. Defendant Province of St. Anthony of Padua of the Conventual Franciscans, also known as St. Anthony of Padua Province of the Conventual Franciscans ("St. Anthony Province") was at relevant times a province of a religious order of the Roman Catholic Church, The Franciscan Fathers, Minor Conventuals, also known as the

Conventual Franciscans, Friars Minor Conventual ("Conventual Franciscans"). Defendant St. Anthony Province has its principal office in Maryland. At all relevant times, Defendant St. Anthony Province conducted activities in Erie County, New York, including operating St. Francis High School of Athol Springs, N.Y.

7. Defendant St. Anthony of Padua Province, Franciscan Fathers Minor Conventual, U.S.A. ("St. Anthony N.Y.") is a New York not-for-profit corporation which at relevant times conducted activities in Erie County, New York, including operating St. Francis High School of Athol Springs, N.Y.

8. Defendant Franciscan Fathers Minor Conventuals of Buffalo, N.Y. ("Conventual Franciscans Buffalo") is a New York not-for-profit corporation which at relevant times conducted activities in Erie County, New York, including operating St. Francis High School of Athol Springs, N.Y.

9. Defendant Franciscan Fathers Minor Conventual, St. Anthony of Padua Province ("St. Anthony MA") is a Massachusetts non-profit corporation with its principal office in Massachusetts. At relevant times, St. Anthony MA conducted activities in Erie County, New York, including operating St. Francis High School of Athol Springs, N.Y.

10. Defendant Order of Friars Minor Conventual, St. Anthony of Padua Province, U.S.A., Inc. ("St. Anthony MD") is a Maryland non-stock corporation with its principal office in Maryland. At relevant times, St. Anthony MD conducted activities in Erie County, New York, including operating St. Francis High School of Athol Springs, N.Y.

11. Defendant Our Lady of Angels Province, U.S.A. ("Our Lady Province") is a province of the Conventual Franciscans with its principal office in Ellicott City, Maryland. Our Lady Province was formed in 2014 by the union of the Immaculate Conception Province of the Conventual Franciscans and St. Anthony Province and is the successor to St. Anthony Province.

12. Defendant Franciscan Friars-Our Lady of the Angels Province, Inc. ("Our

Lady Inc.”) is a Maryland non-stock corporation with its principal office in Maryland. Our Lady Inc. was incorporated in 2014, and is a successor to one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD.

13. Defendant St. Francis High School of Athol Springs, N.Y. (“St. Francis High School”) is a Roman Catholic high school with its principal office at 4129 Lake Shore Road, Athol Springs, Erie County, New York, within the Diocese of Buffalo. During all relevant times, St. Francis High School was operated by Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and St. Anthony MD.

FACTS COMMON TO ALL CLAIMS

14. Plaintiff and his family were parishioners of and attended St. Mary of the Lake Church in Hamburg, New York, a parish of the Diocese of Buffalo. Plaintiff and his family were parishioners of the Diocese of Buffalo when Plaintiff was a minor child. In approximately 1972 when Plaintiff was approximately fourteen years of age, Plaintiff began attending St. Francis High School. Plaintiff attended St. Francis High School from approximately 1972 to 1976.

15. During the times relevant to the allegations set forth herein, Father Clement Jarnot, O.F.M.Conv. (“Father Jarnot”) was assigned by Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and St. Anthony MD to be Guidance Counselor and Director of Admissions at St. Francis High School, where Plaintiff attended school. Father Jarnot died in 2008.

16. Through his positions at, within, or for Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School, Father Jarnot was put in direct contact with Plaintiff, a minor student at St. Francis High School.

17. On at least five occasions from approximately 1972 when Plaintiff was approximately fourteen years of age, to approximately 1973 when Plaintiff was approximately fifteen years of age, Father Jarnot instructed Plaintiff to meet with Father Jarnot in Father Jarnot's office at St. Francis High School.

18. Father Jarnot used such encounters, gained through his position at St. Francis High School which granted him access to Plaintiff when Plaintiff was approximately fourteen to approximately fifteen years of age, to sexually assault, sexually abuse, and have sexual contact with the Plaintiff in violation of the laws of the State of New York.

Defendants' Responsibility for the Abuse Committed by Father Jarnot

19. At all times material hereto, Father Jarnot was under the management, supervision, employ, direction and/or control of Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School.

20. Through his positions at, within, or for Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School, Father Jarnot was put in direct contact with Plaintiff.

21. Father Jarnot used his position at, within, or for Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School and the implicit representations made by them about his character that accompanied that position, to gain Plaintiff's trust and confidence and to create an opportunity to be alone with, and touch, Plaintiff.

22. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School had the duty to reasonably manage, supervise, control and/or direct priests who

served at St. Francis High School, and specifically, had a duty not to aid pedophiles such as Father Jarnot by assigning, maintaining, and/or appointing them to positions with access to minors.

23. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School knew and/or reasonably should have known, and/or knowingly condoned, and/or covered up, the inappropriate and unlawful sexual activities of Father Jarnot, who sexually abused Plaintiff.

24. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School had a duty to the Plaintiff to properly supervise priests to ensure that priests did not use their positions with Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School as a tool for grooming and assaulting vulnerable children. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School knew or should have known that Father Jarnot used his positions to sexually abuse minor children, including the Plaintiff.

Consequences of the Abuse

25. Plaintiff suffered personal physical and psychological injuries and damages as a result of Father Jarnot's actions, as well as other damages related thereto, as a result of the childhood sexual abuse Plaintiff sustained.

26. As a direct result of the Defendants Diocese of Buffalo's; St. Anthony Province's; St. Anthony N.Y.'s; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo's; St. Anthony MA's; St. Anthony MD's; and St. Francis High School's conduct described herein, Plaintiff suffered and will continue to suffer great pain of mind and body, severe and permanent emotional distress, and physical manifestations of emotional distress. Plaintiff was prevented from

obtaining the full enjoyment of life; has incurred and will continue to incur expenses for medical and psychological treatment, therapy, and counseling; and has incurred and will continue to incur loss of income and/or loss of earning capacity. As a victim of Father Jarnot's sexual abuse, Plaintiff is unable at this time to fully describe all of the details of that abuse and the extent of the harm he suffered as a result.

CAUSES OF ACTION

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

Negligent Hiring/Retention/Supervision/Direction

27. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges each and every allegation set forth in paragraphs 1 through 26 as if fully set forth herein.

28. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School owed a duty of care to all minor persons, including Plaintiff, who were likely to come within the influence or supervision of Father Jarnot in his role as priest, counselor, trustee, director, officer, employee, agent, servant and/or volunteer, to insure that Father Jarnot did not use his assigned position to injure minors by sexual assault, sexual abuse, or sexual contact in violation of the laws of the State of New York.

29. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School at all relevant times held the schools of the Diocese of Buffalo out to be safe places for minors to attend, and the assigned priests as individuals to whom it was safe to entrust the care of minor children. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School entered into an express and/or implied duty to safely treat Plaintiff and assumed the duty to protect and care for him.

30. Father Jarnot sexually assaulted, sexually abused, and had sexual contact with Plaintiff in Father Jarnot's office at St. Francis High School when Plaintiff was a

minor.

31. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School negligently hired, retained, directed, and supervised Father Jarnot, though they knew or should have known that Father Jarnot posed a threat of sexual abuse to minors.

32. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School knew or should have known of Father Jarnot's propensity for the conduct which caused Plaintiff's injuries prior to, or at the time of, the injuries' occurrence.

33. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School were negligent in failing to properly supervise Father Jarnot.

34. The sexual abuse of children by adults, including religious order priests, is a foreseeable result of negligence.

35. At all times material hereto, Defendants Diocese of Buffalo's; St. Anthony Province's; St. Anthony N.Y.'s; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo's; St. Anthony MA's; St. Anthony MD's; and St. Francis High School's actions were willful, wanton, malicious, reckless, negligent and/or outrageous in their disregard for the rights and safety of Plaintiff.

36. As a direct and proximate result, Plaintiff has suffered and will continue to suffer the injuries described herein.

37. Liabilities of Defendant St. Anthony Province were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Province. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Province is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by Defendant St. Anthony Province stated in this cause of action.

38. Liabilities of one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD were

transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Inc. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Inc. is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD, as stated in this cause of action.

39. By reason of the foregoing, the Defendants are liable to the Plaintiff, jointly, severally and/or in the alternative liable to the Plaintiff for compensatory damages and for punitive damages, together with interest and costs.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

Negligence/Gross Negligence

40. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges each and every allegation set forth in paragraphs 1 through 26 as if fully set forth herein.

41. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School knew, or were negligent in not knowing, that Father Jarnot posed a threat of sexual abuse to children.

42. The acts of Father Jarnot described hereinabove were undertaken, and/or enabled by, and/or during the course, and/or within the scope of his respective employment, appointment, assignment, and/or agency with Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School.

43. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School owed Plaintiff, a minor at the relevant times of abuse, a duty to protect him from Father Jarnot's sexual deviancy and the consequential damages, both prior to and/or subsequent to Father Jarnot's misconduct.

44. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo's; St. Anthony Province's; St. Anthony N.Y.'s; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo's; St. Anthony MA's; St. Anthony MD's; and St.

Francis High School's willful, wanton, grossly negligent and/or negligent act(s) of commission and/or omission, resulted directly and/or proximately in the damage set forth herein at length.

45. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School:

- a. gave improper or ambiguous orders or failed to make proper regulations, and/or employed improper persons or instrumentalities in work involving risk of harm to others;
- b. failed adequately to supervise the activities of Father Jarnot;
- c. permitted, and/or intentionally failed and/or neglected to prevent, negligent and/or grossly negligent conduct and/or allowed other tortious conduct by persons, whether or not their servants and/or agents and/or employees, upon premises or with instrumentalities under their control; and
- d. allowed the acts of omission and/or commission and/or any or all of the allegations set forth in this Complaint to occur.

46. At all times material hereto, with regard to the allegations contained herein, Father Jarnot was under the supervision, employ, direction and/or control of Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School.

47. At all times material hereto, Defendants Diocese of Buffalo's; St. Anthony Province's; St. Anthony N.Y.'s; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo's; St. Anthony MA's; St. Anthony MD's; and St. Francis High School's actions were willful, wanton, malicious, reckless, negligent and outrageous in their disregard for the rights and safety of Plaintiff, which amounted to conduct equivalent to criminality.

48. As a direct and/or indirect result of said conduct, Plaintiff has suffered

and will continue to suffer the injuries and damages described herein.

49. Liabilities of Defendant St. Anthony Province were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Province. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Province is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by Defendant St. Anthony Province stated in this cause of action.

50. Liabilities of one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Inc. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Inc. is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD, as stated in this cause of action.

51. By reason of the foregoing, the Defendants are liable to the Plaintiff, jointly, severally and/or in the alternative liable to the Plaintiff for compensatory damages and for punitive damages, together with interest and costs.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

Breach of Non-Delegable Duty

52. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges each and every allegation set forth in paragraphs 1 through 26 as if fully set forth herein.

53. Plaintiff, when he was a minor, was placed in the care and supervision of the Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School for the purposes of, *inter alia*, providing Plaintiff with a safe environment in which to receive an education. There existed a non-delegable duty of trust between Plaintiff and Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School.

54. Plaintiff was a vulnerable child when placed within the care of Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans

Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School.

55. As a consequence, Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School were in the best position to prevent Plaintiff's abuse, to learn of Father Jarnot's repeated sexual abuse of Plaintiff, and to stop it.

56. By virtue of the fact that Plaintiff was sexually abused as a minor child entrusted to the care of the Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School, Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School breached their non-delegable duty to Plaintiff.

57. At all times material hereto Father Jarnot was under the supervision, employ, direction and/or control of the Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School.

58. As a direct result of said conduct, Plaintiff has suffered and will continue to suffer the injuries and damages described herein.

59. Liabilities of Defendant St. Anthony Province were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Province. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Province is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by Defendant St. Anthony Province stated in this cause of action.

60. Liabilities of one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Inc. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Inc. is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD, as stated in this cause of action.

61. By reason of the foregoing, the Defendants are liable to the Plaintiff, jointly, severally and/or in the alternative liable to the Plaintiff for compensatory damages and for punitive damages, together with interest and costs.

FOURTH CAUSE OF ACTION

Breach of Fiduciary Duty

62. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges each and every allegation set forth in paragraphs 1 through 26 as if fully set forth herein.

63. There exists a fiduciary relationship of trust, confidence, and reliance between Plaintiff and Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School. This relationship is based on the entrustment of the Plaintiff while he was a minor child to the care and supervision of the agent or servant of the Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School. This entrustment of the Plaintiff to the care and supervision of the Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School, while the Plaintiff was a minor child, required the Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School to assume a fiduciary relationship and to act in the best interests of the Plaintiff, as well as to protect him while he was a minor and vulnerable child.

64. Pursuant to their fiduciary relationship, Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School were entrusted with the well-being, care, and safety of Plaintiff.

65. Pursuant to their fiduciary relationship, Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA;

St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School assumed a duty to act in the best interests of Plaintiff.

66. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School breached their fiduciary duty to Plaintiff.

67. At all times material hereto, the actions and/or inactions of Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School were willful, wanton, malicious, reckless, negligent and outrageous in their disregard for the rights and safety of Plaintiff.

68. As a direct result of said conduct, Plaintiff has suffered and will continue to suffer the injuries and damages described herein.

69. Liabilities of Defendant St. Anthony Province were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Province. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Province is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by Defendant St. Anthony Province stated in this cause of action.

70. Liabilities of one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Inc. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Inc. is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD, as stated in this cause of action.

71. By reason of the foregoing, the Defendants are liable to the Plaintiff, jointly, severally and/or in the alternative liable to the Plaintiff for compensatory damages and for punitive damages, together with interest and costs.

FIFTH CAUSE OF ACTION**Negligent Infliction of Emotional Distress**

72. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges each and every allegation set forth in paragraphs 1 through 26 as if fully set forth herein.

73. As described above, the actions of Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School, their agents, servants, and/or employees were conducted in a negligent and/or grossly negligent manner.

74. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo's; St. Anthony Province's; St. Anthony N.Y.'s; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo's; St. Anthony MA's; St. Anthony MD's; and St. Francis High School's actions endangered Plaintiff's safety and caused him to fear for his own safety.

75. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants Diocese of Buffalo's; St. Anthony Province's; St. Anthony N.Y.'s; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo's; St. Anthony MA's; St. Anthony MD's; and St. Francis High School's actions, which included but were not limited to negligent and/or grossly negligent conduct, Plaintiff suffered and will continue to suffer the severe injuries and damages described herein, including but not limited to, mental and emotional distress.

76. Liabilities of Defendant St. Anthony Province were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Province. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Province is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by Defendant St. Anthony Province stated in this cause of action.

77. Liabilities of one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Inc. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Inc. is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or

St. Anthony MD, as stated in this cause of action.

78. By reason of the foregoing, the Defendants are liable to the Plaintiff, jointly, severally and/or in the alternative liable to the Plaintiff for compensatory damages and for punitive damages, together with interest and costs.

SIXTH CAUSE OF ACTION

Breach of Duty in Loco Parentis

79. Plaintiff repeats and re-alleges each and every allegation set forth in paragraphs 1 through 26 as if fully set forth herein.

80. While he was a minor, Plaintiff was entrusted by his parents to the control of the Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School, as well as directly to Father Jarnot, an agent or servant of Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School, for the purposes of *inter alia*, providing Plaintiff with appropriate guidance and an opportunity to enjoy educational and youth activities under responsible adult supervision. These Defendants owe – and owed – a duty to children entrusted to them to act *in loco parentis* and to prevent foreseeable injuries.

81. Defendants Diocese of Buffalo; St. Anthony Province; St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; St. Anthony MD; and St. Francis High School breached their duty to act *in loco parentis*.

82. At all times material hereto, Defendants Diocese of Buffalo's; St. Anthony Province's; St. Anthony N.Y.'s; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo's; St. Anthony MA's; St. Anthony MD's; and St. Francis High School's actions were willful, wanton, malicious, reckless, negligent, grossly negligent and/or outrageous in their disregard for the rights and safety of Plaintiff.

83. As a direct result of Defendants Diocese of Buffalo's; St. Anthony

Province's; St. Anthony N.Y.'s; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo's; St. Anthony MA's; St. Anthony MD's; and St. Francis High School's conduct, Plaintiff has suffered and will continue to suffer the injuries and damages described herein.

84. Liabilities of Defendant St. Anthony Province were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Province. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Province is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by Defendant St. Anthony Province stated in this cause of action.

85. Liabilities of one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD were transferred to, or assumed by, Defendant Our Lady Inc. As a result, Defendant Our Lady Inc. is liable to the Plaintiff for the damages caused by one or more of the following Defendants: St. Anthony N.Y.; Conventual Franciscans Buffalo; St. Anthony MA; and/or St. Anthony MD, as stated in this cause of action.

86. By reason of the foregoing, the Defendants are liable to the Plaintiff, jointly, severally and/or in the alternative liable to the Plaintiff for compensatory damages and for punitive damages, together with interest and costs.

WHEREFORE Plaintiff, demands judgment against the Defendants on each cause of action as follows:

- A. Awarding compensatory damages in an amount to be proved at trial, but in any event in an amount that exceeds the jurisdictional limits of all lower courts which would otherwise have jurisdiction;
- B. Awarding punitive damages to the extent permitted by law;
- C. Awarding prejudgment interest to the extent permitted by law;
- D. Awarding costs and fees of this action, including attorneys' fees, to the extent permitted by law; and
- E. Awarding such other and further relief as to this Court may seem just and proper.

JURY DEMAND

Plaintiff demands a trial by jury on all issues so triable.
